#### What inspired you to teach and what was your childhood dream job?

I always loved sport at school and wanted to be a professional of any sport I possibly could from a young age. I was brought up in a very sporty family and was very fortunate to have three fantastic sports teachers when I was in secondary school. In a minibus, on the way home from a football match at 14 years old, one of those teachers said I would make a good P.E. teacher and from that day, I did all I could to do that. I coached the year 7 and 8 pupils at my school, taught P.E. lessons to primary schools while in 6th form and started teaching as soon as I left university. I am very lucky to have had the experiences I have had in sport when growing up.

I have an identical twin brother who is also a teacher, and twin sisters.





Along with two house plays and a sell-out joint schools' production of Les Misérables, it has been a busy term for our Drama Department.


























# From the Archives
